DISASTER SUPPLY KITS

While preparing perfectly for all disaster situations is not possible, preparing well for the most foreseeable disaster situations can save a life. Every home, workplace, and vehicle should hold a supply of food, water, and medicine to support its occupants for as long as practically possible after a disaster. Items to consider:

water and packaged food	batteries and fuel	prescriptions	first aid supplies	flashlights/lanterns
fireproof safes/boxes	cash, checks, credit cards	vital documents	flash drives/CDs	backup hard drives
pet food/prescriptions	leashes/collars/litter	eyeglasses/contacts	whistles/airhorns	tools/blades/firearms

RRFPD COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)

RRFPD CERT is a FEMA-created community program that prepares citizens to directly assist others following a disaster. CERT volunteers are trained in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Deployed by local fire chiefs, CERT volunteers assist their community when professional responders are not immediately available to help. EVACUATION & MAPS

Before disaster strikes, 1) familiarize yourself with the roads and routes out of your neighborhood and the surrounding areas, considering that disaster may make some of them impassable; 2) talk to your neighbors about their expected exit routes and gathering points; 3) attend a neighborhood association meeting; 4) develop community phone trees; and 5) visit the websites above for more detailed information.
